

DRUG CHECKING SERVICES

In Montréal, street drug users and people who purchase drugs from the illicit market are encouraged to use drug checking services.

Substances bought from the illicit market are at high risk of contamination with opioids such as protonitazene, isotonitazene, carfentanil, fentanyl, etc. These substances can lead to overdoses. There can be a difference between what a person thinks they're using and what is really in the substance, which can cause unexpected effects.

Drug checking services offer advice to users so they can make informed decisions and manage their substance use more safely.

Checkpoint, offered by **CACTUS** Montréal, provides a free, anonymous and confidential drug checking service.

Dopamine

- ATR FT-IR spectroscopy
- Colorimetric reaction
